age issues in our community. Although they called it a “500 Year Flood,” it doesn’t take much rain to create drainage problems - from mosquito infestations to property damage.

In response, the Town of Meridian Hills hosted a second drainage presentation for residents on July 14th titled “Drainage 2.0” put on by the Department of Public Works. The Town first hosted a DPW drainage seminar titled “Drainage 101” on March 7, 2006.

Please be sure you’re doing your part by making sure water is able to traverse your property unimpeded; remove leaves, silt and debris from stormwater drains near your property; keep swales free of weeds and debris; and report problems to the Mayor’s Action Center at **327-4622**.



REMEMBERING JAMES TUOHY

The Town of Meridian Hills lost a friend recently with the passing of Mr. James Tuohy on May 2 after a long battle with Parkinson's disease. Mr. Tuohy was very involved in our community serving as Town Councilor from 1979 to 1988, and as Town Attorney for 15 years from 1989 to 2003. The Town was very fortunate to have Mr. Tuohy as an advocate and our condolences go out to his family.



Town Beautification Update

The Town Council approved the installation of four new Town Entry signs in 2007. The construction was expected to begin last fall, but the contractor encountered some scheduling conflicts. We spent the spring completing the necessary paperwork with the city and ironing out the details. Work is now scheduled to begin after Labor Day weekend.

The Town was also notified in December that we finally received a Keep Indianapolis Beautiful grant for 2008. The grant is to improve the green space on the north bend of Meridian Hills Boulevard, where one of the new Town entry signs will be located, however KIB said they were having trouble securing the services of a professional landscape architect. We contacted Jud Scott of Vine &

Branch - one of our Town Partners - and he donated the professional services of his employees to work with us. We developed an improved plan that will enhance the area and one of the major gateways to the Town. In addition, a new decorative streetlight at this location replaced the existing one at *no cost* to the Town. The rest of the work at this location is scheduled for late September.

Lastly, four missing street name signs are being replaced with the new decorative signs.

8. Consider the "target". What will the tree or portion of the tree hit if it falls?

DPW PAVING COLLEGE!

Although the Town of Meridian Hills has almost 12 miles of roads within our boundaries, we share some responsibilities with the City of Indianapolis. The City maintains Meridian, Spring Mill, College and 71st Street. They're also responsible for drainage issues within the Town, including rights-of-way, and culverts and bridges under our roads. We meet often with DPW to work toward improving City issues within the Town.

In the last few years, DPW has added turn-lanes on Meridian at 64th Street and at the entrance to Second Presbyterian Church. At our request, they also installed an east-west pedestrian crossing at College and Nottingham, and have worked with us to replace all the traffic warning signs with the new

diamond-grade fluorescent yellow signs.

This summer, DPW is paving College from 71st Street to 86th Street! We've met several times with DPW to optimize the project for the Town. At our request, they plan to pave 75th Street east of College to the bridge, and re-stripe the shoulder for pedestrian and bicycle use only. Although we have a good relationship with DPW, they still recommend that residents report any issues on these roads to the **Mayor's Action Center at 327-4MAC.**
