We survived the "Blizzard of 2014"! Here are a few photos of the Town of Meridian Hills during the snowstorm...*or at least what it felt like*! Given the timing and severity of the storm, our snow removal efforts kept the streets relatively safe. We're in the process of seeking emergency financial assistance from the state to recoup some of the funds we spent over the last couple weeks.

As the snow continues to melt and rain falls, *there will be flooding*. If you live adjacent to a stormwater drain, please be sure it's clear and free of debris. A lot of flooding on our streets is the result of stormwater drains that are stopped up with leaves.

As the snow continues to melt, we'll also find potholes that need to be fixed. If you see a pothole on Meridian, College, Spring Mill or 71st/73rd, please report them to the Mayor's Action Center at 327-4622. If they are on town streets, please report them to jvorisek@crossroadengineers.com. Prompt notification will help us maintain the high quality of our roads and protect motorists from possible damage to their vehicle.
