The State of the Town of Meridian Hills continues to be good! Following are some accomplishments achieved by the Town throughout this past year:

- Transferred \$30k to Rainy Day Fund
- Passed an Ordinance Amending Pre-Payment of Claims & Warrants
- Passed Ordinances Approving the Transfer of Funds from the General Fund
- · Appointed a new Councilman to replace the resigning Councilwoman
- Appointed a new Clerk Treasurer to replace the resigning Clerk Treasurer
- Approved London Witte Group to replace the resigning Assistant Clerk Treasurer
- Recognized resigning Town Administration
- Landscaped the Town Entry Signs at no Cost to the Town
- Passed a Required Ordinance to Re-establish the Town Rainy Day Fund
- Passed a Required Ordinance to Re-establish the Town Beautification Fund
- Passed a Required Ordinance to Re-establish the Town 80/20 Plan
- Approved Installation of 2 Historic Markers in Sherwood Village & Wellington
- Approved Installation of 25 Overhead Street Name Blades, installed by DPW at no cost to the Town
- Worked with DPW & Citizens Energy Group to restore Several Drainage Ditches & Repair/ Clean Several Culverts at no cost to the Town
- Updated the Town Municipal Code
- Approved the Resident-Funded Sherwood Village Little Library
- Reviewed & Developed Positions on Approximately a Dozen Variance Requests
- Redesigned the Town Website to Improve Layout, Function on Mobile Devises, and Security
- Worked with DPW to include resurfacing of Arden Drive, between Pennsylvania and Meridian, at no cost to the Town
- Approved Land Survey of Central Avenue & Continued to Work with Residents, DPW & Citizens Energy Group Toward a Resolution of an Ongoing Drainage Issue
- Updated the Roadway Management Program, while Deferring 2015 Maintenance Funds to 2016 for Better Efficiency
- Worked with DPW & Offered Input on Rebuild Indy 2 Projects that would Affect the Town
- Hosted a Public Meeting Regarding Indy Rezone & the Red Line Rapid Transit Project
- Successfully Lobbied Division of Forestry to Perform Approximately \$5,000 of Tree Work at no cost to the Town
- Inventoried Town Entry Signs, Historical Markers, Street Name Signs, Streetlights, Traffic Signs
- Raised \$7,377.64 toward 80/20 Plan for 72nd Street Traffic Calming Project
- Modified Intersection at 72nd & Meridian to Reduce Cut-through Traffic
- Moved Town Insurance to New Carrier

- Continued Tradition of Town Police Passing out Halloween Candy while Patrolling in the Police Vehicle
- Raised \$11,502 toward 80/20 Plan for Decorative Streetlights
- Approved Installation of 9 new Decorative Washington-style Streetlights throughout the Town, using Town's 80/20 Plan
- Passed an Ordinance to Approve 2016 Salaries & Wages
- Passed an Ordinance to Amend the Order of Regular Council Meetings
- Passed an Ordinance to Modify Town Streetlight Specification as Relates to Bulbs to Comply with City Standards & Availability
- Increased Town Budget by \$75,900 to Allow for Appropriations from Existing Funds
- Approved a Balanced Budget for 2016

- Work with DPW regarding a Town-wide Drainage Analysis
- Work with DPW regarding a Possible Speed Radar Sign on Meridian Hills Blvd
- Work with DPW to improve the bridge at 7800 Spring Mill
