## Sherwood Village Neighborhood

The land that eventually became Sherwood Village was first granted to James Bonnell by the U.S. Government in 1822. In 1872, the property was conveyed to Lorenzo Van Scyoc and became part of the Van Scyoc Farm.

Although Sherwood Village was subdivided in 1940 by the Fletcher Trust Company, the first home was built in 1937 at 738 Sherwood Drive.

Bounded on the north and east by Marott Park, Williams Creek, and a tributary of the White River; on the west by College Avenue; and on the south by 71st Street, the neighborhood was included in the incorporation of the Town of Meridian Hills in 1937, which was then known as “The Front Yard of Indianapolis.”

## Town Historic Marker

### Sherwood Village Neighborhood

- What: A 27” x 36” cast aluminum historical marker - similar, but smaller than the Town marker at 75th and Pennsylvania - placed on the south side of Sherwood Drive for eastbound traffic entering the neighborhood.
- Why: To continue to build a sense of community, identify distinct neighborhoods within the Town of Meridian Hills, and improve property values and quality of life.
- Cost: **\$1,860**
